The State Theatre of Pennsylvania

The Bucks County Playhouse is located on the site of a former grist mill on the banks of the Delaware River in New Hope, Pennsylvania.

The original structure was built in 1790 when owner Benjamin Parry rebuilt the Hope Mills, which had burned down. The newly christened New Hope Mills inspired the village to change its name from Coryell's Ferry to New Hope.

Facing demolition in the 1930's the site was saved when a small band of artists helped rally the local community to renovate it as a theater. The Bucks County Playhouse opened in July 1939 and remained in continuous operation until December 2010.

This beloved theatrical landmark was beautifully renovated and re-opened in July 2012 exactly 73 years from the original opening.
